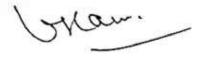

We also look for your continued support to help kith and kin of the departed come forward to donate their eyes and hence spread hope and light for many of our fellow brethren in darkness.

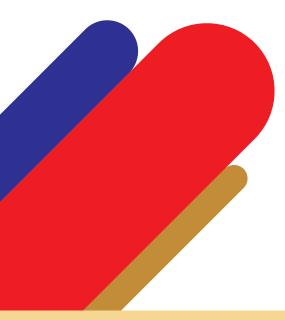

It gives me immense pleasure and satisfaction, to be able to bring smile on the gloomy faces of the large populace of disadvantaged section of the society in the year 2022-23. The year ended on 31st March 2023was eventful as always with addition of some new activities.

I now present Performance of Delhi centre during the year 2022-2023:

Total OPD consultations/tests	: 2,82,248	
Patients examined in centres	: 1,22,067	
Patients examined in camps	: 1,58,787	
Camps organized	: 354	
Cataract Surgeries performed	: 1,394	
Eye Donations	: 13	

With these figures, it is evident that MID has been able to pursue it's main object primary health care services to the downtrodden section of the society, more aggressively and effectively through its project-Doctor at Door step by organizing 354 Eye and Health Checkup Camps and achieved our target of "ONE CAMP A DAY". Out of total 354 camps, 150 camps were organized in Delhi NCR and 204 camps were organized pan India with the help of other centers of Mahavir international. With the unstinted, unconditional, continuous, dedicated and active support of local centers of MI, we have been able to do this herculin task with ease and maintaining high level of quality, keeping the faith and confidence shown by our sponsors, intact. I express my heartfelt thanks and gratitude to the entire team of local centers from the bottom of my heart. In furtherance of primary eye and health care services, Other than our regular activity of providing healthcare services, a **Retina Unit** was inaugurated t Lala Aman Singh Jain charitable Eye and Medical Centre, Hauz Rani on the auspicious occasion of Mahavir Jayanti in April 2022.

Under the new initiative Mahavir International Delhi in its effort to empower the unemployed youth from the distressed & under privileged by commencing training programs as NURSING ASSISTANTS. I am happy to share that in the first year itself, 24 students have successfully completed their course. One project on sewing Training under initiative **SWAVLAMBAN** project for **WOMEN EMPOWERMENT INITIATIVE** of MI Apex under the wings of Vira vision was also stared at Rajdhani Charitable Eye and Medical Centre Nabi Karim.

MID had taken-up the project **SWASTHYA SAHELI** for women where a trained General Duty Assistant is providing counselling on mensuration and women health at the hospitals.

LOVE ALL – SERVE ALL LIVE AND LET LIVE

Mahavir International Delhi (MID) was established in 1979 and has been engaged in social service activities since its inception.

OUR VISION

Work selflessly and tirelessly towards laying the foundation of creating a healthy society with special focus on timely diagnosis of diseases to prevent their aggravation in order to improve overall health of disadvantaged sections of society while aiming for a cataract free Delhi and ultimately, the rest of india.

OUR MISSION

To expand reach and spread of health care facilities by organizing one mobile health check-up Camp a day in rural, remote and slum areas by empowering people, especially women by creating knowledge and awareness about the need for better health and hygiene through sustained publicity and prevention of diseases. Manage and operate more free or affordable medical and diagnostic centers and set up our own eye bank.

OUR MAJOR FOCUS

Mahavir International's primary focus is health care with special emphasis on Eye care. Its motto is 'Love All Serve All' and mission is to make 'Delhi Cataract Free' as the said ailment is the major cause of blindness in the country (66% as per AllMS report of 2018). It also works towards the elimination of blindness by motivating people for "Eye Pledge" and for "Eye donation" of relatives of people after their death. We have 3 charitable hospitals in Delhi. Our focus is on quality health services for the underprivileged in the city — including daily wagers, street vendors, migrant laborers and treating their families with care, concern and compassion. OPD services are provided at nominal registration fee, along with free medicines and diagnostic tests at highly subsidized rates.

All these centers provide comprehensive medical services in the field of Eyes, General Medicine, Women's health consultation / counseling, Homeopathy, Ayurveda, Physiotherapy and ultra modern and well equipped diagnostic laboratories. We also have State of the Art Operation Theaters for cataract correction surgeries. At Hauz Rani hospital, a Retina treatment facility is also available.

At the same time there is a constant need to upgrade/replace our equipment to cater better to the needy, so that they are not deprived of quality health care.

OUR OTHER SIGNIFICANT PROJECTS

1. DOCTOR AT DOOR STEP

Under our flagship project 'DOCTOR AT DOORSTEP,' we have organized more than 3578 free check-up camps resulting in more than 54 lacs consultations. Here, health checkup facilities are offered either in remote locations with limited access to quality health care or at locations in and round the premises or operations of our sponsors. The services offered in these checks include consultation by general physicians, female doctors, eye specialists, optometrists, ECG, blood tests as well as distribution of medicines and spectacles. Those detected with cataract are thereafter provided with free / subsidized correction surgeries at centers of MID or our affiliates.

Acknowledging the impact of these camps in terms of taking health care to the Doorstep of the poor, various leading Business and Corporate Houses including Public Sector Enterprises and Banks have come forward to give us grants for conducting the same. They include **CONCOR**, **RITES**, **GAIL**, **IOCL**, **EIL**, **ONGC**, **ALICMO**, **CWC**, **SAIL**, **NBCFDC**, **NMDFC**, **NSKFDC**, **TFCI**, **FLUOR DANIEL INDIA PVT LTD**, **RAJDHANI BESAN GROUP**, **SAFEXPRESS**. **VIBES**.







2. 'झांके नन्ही आँखों में'

Mahavir International recognises the need for early vision correction in the underprivileged children. Otherwise, apart from suffering from health issues, their education also suffers. In earlier years, MID Participated in the Chacha Nehru Sehat Yojana of Delhi Government. Under this scheme, we carried out comprehensive health check up and health counseling to students of 12 schools covering nearly 5812 students.

Recently, Mahavir International has re-launched the project in a slightly modified form under the tag "झांके नन्ही आँखों में". In this project, Mahavir International is organizing camps in schools run by MCD and other NGOs to carry out prompt vision correction by provision of spectacles in a timely manner. During the FY 2022-23, 29 such camps were organized, resulting in check up of more than 3000 students and distribution of nearly 650 spectacles.









3. SWABHLAMBAN

Under the new initiative "SWABHLAMBAN" MID in its effort to empower the unemployed women in and around its centers is carrying out the following interventions:-

a. Sewing Training

MID has affiliated with 'Singer' to provide up to six months of training in appeal production for underprivileged women living around its center at Nabi Karim. A total of 52 women have been trained till date. Further to encourage





their entrepreneurial instincts, they have participated in fashion shows as well as in exhibition and sale of their products.

b. General Duty Assistants

Another such initiative has been the training of underprivileged women as "General Duty Assistants". The first course was started on 25th April, 2022 and till date 71 women have been trained and certified by Apollo





Mediskills. Almost all the trained beneficiaries have also been provided internship opportunities, with some carrying on in jobs..

c. Swasthya Saheli

MID had taken-up the project SWASTHYA SAHELI for women where trained GDA's are providing counseling on menstruation and women health issues such as menstruation and breastfeeding at





our centers. Since its start in March 2023, nearly **10000 women** have been benefited with these services. We are also generating ABHA Cards for patients who visit our centers, which will entitle them to avail benefits under PM Jan Arogya Yojna (PM-JAY). Till date nearly **400** ABHA cards have been generated.

Some of its activities include provision of hygiene and nutritional support and distribution of baby kits, sanitary napkins, and warm clothes to the needy.

a. COVID-19 Relief Project

VIRA VISION ACTIVITIES

"Vira Vision" as the name suggests, comprises of a group of women members of MID working with compassion for all underprivileged in general and for women in particular. We adopt and implement some of the national projects initiated by MI Apex besides running our own local projects. Some of our notable activities are enlisted below...

- 1. MOTHER & CHILD CARE under which we undertake distribution of baby kits for new born and sanitary napkins for mothers at government hospitals besides counseling the latter on cleanliness/hygiene.
- 2.SWABHLAMBHAN project, to vocationally empower women. This programme includes Sewing Classess being conducted in coordination with Singer .These training programmes are being conducted at our centres and till date 49 women especially youth have benifitted from these initiatives.

- 5. PROJECT JANETRI is an upcoming initiative to spread awareness of pre and post natal issues to pregnant women and new mothers through special workshops being planned at our centres. This will include distribution of baby kits and nutrients to the attendees.

Another redeeming feature of these interventions is that the Viras personally contribute to support these impactfull projects and also interact one on one with the beneficiaries making them feel loved.

Vira Vision hopes to carry on with the above initiatives as also new ones with the spirit of Love All Serve All' in the coming times.

Shedding Light on Cataract

ataract ('Motiyabind') is clouding of the lens of the eye that leads to decrease in vision. It often develops slowly and can affect one or both the eyes.

Cataract is the most prevalent ophthalmic disease. About 22 million people are blind due to cataract worldwide. In India it is the principal cause of blindness (66.2%).

As a leading cause of vision impairment worldwide, cataract deserves attention and awareness to facilitate early detection, prevention and proper management. Blindness due to cataract presents an enormous problem in India not only in terms of human morbidity but also in terms of economic loss and social burden.





Cataract is most commonly due to aging, usually seen after the age of 40 years. It can be present from birth which may be due to genetic factors, maternal infections during pregnancy, or certain medications taken during pregnancy. Cataract can occur due to trauma or radiation exposure. Other risk factors include diabetes, long standing use of

 $corticos teroid\ medication, smoking\ to bacco, prolonged\ exposure\ to\ sunlight, and\ alcohol.$

Patient may notice fading or yellowing of colors, blurred vision, halos around light, and frequent change of glasses. Some patients may encounter difficulty in driving at night due to bright light of headlights.

In advanced cataract, patients may notice white colouration at the centre of the eye.

While some risk factors for cataract, such as age and genetics, are beyond one's control, several lifestyle choices can influence the likelihood of developing cataract.

Consuming a diet rich in antioxidants such as vitamin C and E, eating green leafy vegetables and fruits, wearing sunglasses that block harmful ultraviolet (UV) rays, quitting smoking and limiting alcohol consumption may slow the progression of cataract formation. It is also important to keep blood sugar levels under control.

Having regular eye check-ups to detect cataract in their early stages, allows for timely intervention. Timely surgical removal of cataracts can significantly improve vision and quality of life.

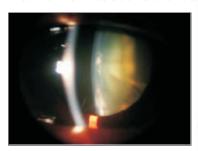


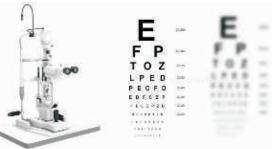

Severity of cataract formation, assuming no other eye disease is present, is judged primarily by visual acuity test and slit lamp examination. Initial stages of visual impairment may be improved with glasses. If this does not help, surgery to remove the cloudy lens and replace it with an artificial lens is the only effective treatment. No medical intervention has been beneficial.





Decision of surgery depends on a patient's visual needs and requirements. If cataract is impacting the person's daily or occupational activities one may consider cataract surgery. Certain occupations require early surgical intervention like doctors, drivers,

teachers and tailors. Cataract removal can be performed at any stage and no longer requires ripening of the lens. Surgery should not be delayed in advance cataract as it can cause lens induced glaucoma. Surgery is a day-care procedure and patient is discharged on the day of surgery.

Phacoemulsification is the most widely used cataract surgery. This procedure uses ultrasonic energy to emulsify the cataractous lens through a small incision which does not require sutures. There is a misconception that it is a laser procedure.

Femtosecond Laser-Assisted Cataract Surgery is an advanced technique that utilizes a femtosecond laser to perform several key steps of cataract surgery. This technology enhances the precision and predictability of the procedure.

After removing the natural lens, an artificial intraocular lens isimplanted which stays in the eye permanently.





Recovery from cataract surgery is generally quick. Patients may experience improved vision within a day, although complete recovery may take a few weeks.





The choice of intraocular lens depends upon patient's profile and occupation. There are different types of intraocular lenses which are available such as monofocal, multifocal, toric, Extended Depth Of Focus (EDOF) lenses. Some of the popular brands for intraocular lenses are Bausch and Lomb, Alcon, Hoya, Eyhance, Vivity.

Monofocal lenses correct for either distance or near vision.

Multifocal lenses may be implanted to improve near and distance vision simultaneously, but these lenses may increase the chances of glare.

Toric IOLs are beneficial in patients who have cylindrical power hence improving overall vision quality.

Extended Depth Of Focus IOLs: Aim to mimic the natural focusing ability of the eye, potentially reducing the need for glasses for distance and intermediate vision. These are the latest advancement in intraocular lenses.

Post cataract surgery patients are typically prescribed eye drops to prevent infection and inflammation. They are advised to avoid activities that might strain the eyes such as heavy lifting or bending for about a month. Protective eye wear and ways to maintain hygiene are explained and follow up appointments are advised to monitor the healing process and ensuring optimal visual outcome.

In certain rural areas, limited access to healthcare facilities and eye care services can lead to delayed detection and treatment of cataract. Efforts have been made to address the issue through various healthcare initiatives including eye care camps, awareness campaigns, and subsidized or free cataract surgeries.

By fostering awareness about cataract, we can empower individuals to take proactive steps to protect their vision, leading to a healthier and more fulfilling life. Together, let us work towards a future where cataract is well understood, easily detected and effectively managed, ensuring a world with clearer vision for all.

यह स्वास्थ्य सहेली अब दिल्ली केंद्र द्वारा संचालित अस्पतालों में अपनी सेवा दे रही है और वन्हा आने वाली महिलाओं की समस्यों को सुनकर समझ कर उन्हें सलाह देती है ज़रूरत होने पर चिकित्स्य सलाह के लिए उन्हें समझाती है जिससे महिलाओं को मानसिक सम्बल मिलता है।

परियोजना के नाम अनुसार यह एक दोस्ताना अनुबंध है एक महिला मरीज़ व सेवा प्रदाता के मध्य जिसके फलस्वरूप एक महिला को सही और सटीक सलाह प्राप्त हो रही है और दूसरी तरफ़ प्रक्षिशण प्राप्त कर सफल विधार्थियों को रोज़गार भी मिलता है।

GLAUCOMA or "Kaala Motiya" The Silent thief of Eye

he leading cause of Irreversible blindness in the world. Unlike blindness caused by cataracts which can be reversed with surgery, eyesight lost due to glaucoma is gone forever.

Glaucoma is a disease of the optic nerve that can affect people of any age, including children. By far the most commonly affected are individuals above 40 years of age. It affects approximately 60 million people globally. In India, it affects approximately 12 million people, of whom 1.5 million are blind.

Individuals with the following risk factors have a higher chance of developing or having glaucoma: Elevated intraocular pressure (eye pressure), age >40 years, family history of glaucoma, among people who marry within their family, diabetics, hypertensives, history of using steroid medication, having history of multiple eye surgeries or eye trauma.

In newborns having glaucoma the manifestations can include big eyes, whitish or blue eyes, excessive watering, child will have difficulty in opening eyes. Immediate consultation should be sought.

Treatment includes early surgical intervention.

Most cases of glaucoma have no symptoms or very subtle symptoms. In this disease the vision loss slowly starts at the edges of the visual fields (peripheral vision) and then eventually the entire vision is lost. 90 % of the people in the society with glaucoma are undiagnosed. Most of the people with undiagnosed glaucoma do not realize that there is a problem until they have lost a large area of their vision. Hence it is

the Silent thief of eye sight.

A small percentage of people with glaucoma have episodes of eye pain, blurred vision, redness, headache with nausea or vomiting and seeing rainbow colored rings around lights.

An ophthalmologists (eye doctor) examines the nerve of the eye (optic nerve), measures the eye pressure and views the fluid drain of the eye. Specific tests that are done in an eye opd for diagnosing glaucoma include:

- 1. Eye pressure test (Intraocular pressure/ often referred as IOP)
- 2. Eye fluid drainage visualisation using special gonio lens (Gonioscopy)
- 3. Visual field analysis
- 4. Optical Coherence Tomography (OCT) of optic nerve head and the retinal nerve fibre layer
- 5. Fundus evaluation

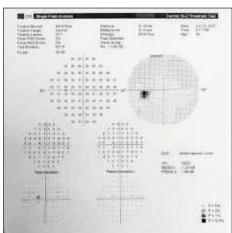

Fundus and Optic Nerve Evaluation

Damage to the optic nerve caused by this disease is permanent. Hence it cannot be cured but can be controlled, if diagnosed early.

If detected early, your doctor can help preserve your remaining vision. So, please consult your eye specialist, and test for glaucoma if you are more than 40 years of age, or if a person is having any of the risk factors.

Depending on the type and stage of the disease

Normal optic nerve head Glaucomatous cupping

at the time of detection, treatment options include medical therapy, laser or surgical intervention.

Initial medical therapy includes starting eye drops of one class of anti-glaucoma medications i.e., Monotherapy (most commonly - Beta Blockers and Prostaglandin analogue). If this fails to control the eye pressure, Dual therapy or combination therapy is started in which another class of eye drop are added to the therapy. If dual therapy fails then, a third class of eye drop are added – Maximum Medical Therapy (MMT).

> Further, if MMT fails, patient is then given the option of laser therapy (SLT) and surgical intervention.

Since, there is no cure, lifelong monitoring is needed.

One of the most important aspect of controlling eye pressure after diagnosis is compliance by the patient. Once, started on the eye drops, the individual should make sure to

put the eye drops as advised and not to miss. It must be continued lifelong.

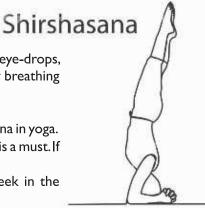
While putting the eye drops, lower eyelid should be pulled nicely to create a small pocket. ONE drop of the medicine is to be instilled in the pocket of the eye. At the time, when the doctor is prescribing the anti-glaucoma eye-drops, one must disclose any other systemic illnesses that they may have, especially if any breathing problems like asthma.

Once diagnosed, a few lifestyle changes are advised:

Do not drink I-2 litres water at once and avoid head down posture, Shirshasana in yoga.

Regular follow-ups with the doctor as advised or every 6 months or yearly is a must. If diagnosed as advanced glaucoma, once every month checkup should be done.

To ensure awareness across the globe, we celebrate World Glaucoma Week in the month of March every year to beat the invisible glaucoma.

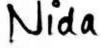

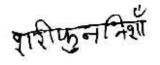
